

BIRDS OF OSBORNE PENINSULA

Threatened Species Powerful Owl; Barking Owl

Resident Birds Australian magpie; Australian magpie lark, Grey shrike thrush; Superb blue wren, Grey currawong; Spotted pardalote; Common bronze-wing pigeon, Scrub wren, Wattlebird; Eastern spinebill, Grey butcher bird. Bell miners and noisy miners live in colonies and have a tendency to drive smaller native birds away.

Regular Visiting Birds Sulphur-crested cockatoo; Gang-gang cockatoo, Galah, Corella (Long billed); Rainbow lorikeet; Crimson rosella; Eastern rosella; King parrot; Kookaburra; Spur-winged plover; Tawny frogmouth; White faced heron; Brown goshawk

Seasonal Visiting Birds Pallid cuckoo; Fan-tailed cuckoo

Rare Visiting Birds Azure king fisher; Australian ground thrush (or speckled thrush); Yellow-breasted robin; Owlet nightjar; Powerful owl; Barking owl; Darter (or Snake bird); Cormorant; Dusky morehen; Tree-creeper; Grey fantail; Golden whistler; Rose robin; Weebill; Silvereye; Olive-backed oriole; Straw-necked ibis.

Visiting Birds Wood duck; Black duck; Wedge tailed eagle

Over Visiting Birds (Passing through the area) Yellow-tailed black cockatoo; Black-faces cuckoo shrike; White-winged chough; Firetail; Rufus fantail; Pied currawong.

Introduced Birds Welcome swallows, Indian turtle dove and Blackbirds which distribute seeds of pest plants throughout the bush. Indian mynah is an abundant species and because it can drive native birds away or occupy their nesting hollows, they are to be
